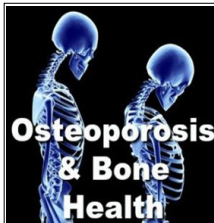

Mission in Motion from Sacred Heart Health Systems will be visiting Tuesday, February 20th, from 9:00am - 11:30am to screen for **Osteoporosis**. This service will be available to everyone over 18 years of age at no cost. Osteoporosis in the U.S. affects approximately 8 million women and 2 million men and involves a gradual weakening of bones. Bone is constantly regenerating in a young body. New bone is created faster than old bone is broken down resulting in high density (mass) for strong bones. Bone is made up of collagen, calcium and other minerals. Usually after the age of 30 years, bone does not regenerate as fast resulting in weak and brittle bones. The less dense bone can easily break under pressure or falls. Primary or Type I osteoporosis develops in women who have gone through menopause and have decreased levels of estrogen. Secondary or Type II osteoporosis is also known as senile osteoporosis can lead to hip fractures. Heredity plays an important role in causing osteoporosis. Symptoms are not visible until quite late. Preventive measures include eating fruits and vegetables that contain calcium and vitamin D in your diet. Your body needs calcium for strong bones and your bones need vitamin D to absorb calcium. Exercise, avoid smoking and excess alcohol, and ensure safety measures to prevent falls. We all are aware of this opportunity to maintain better health from last year's visit from Sacred Heart---see you there!

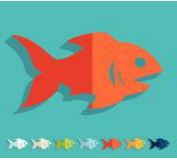
Plea for Volunteers for the Alfred-Washburn Center

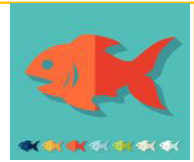
