


### **Hand to Paw Project**

So here is the update on Catholic Argos:

Two weeks ago we had a group discussion about "freedom". We challenged some common ideas about freedom and looked to our actual experience of freedom to begin to discover what freedom really is. We discovered freedom is not just freedom **from**, but freedom **for**: freedom for love, freedom for beauty. We realized that although I can feel free doing something for myself, I am always most free within a relationship. Other people are not an obstacle to my freedom, but an opportunity to experience love, and that is where I feel most free. Really, I feel free when I am fulfilled. So love, fulfillment, relationship turn out to be more important for my experience of freedom than independence, choices, and doing whatever I feel like.

All of this is pointing to last week's proposal about "Encounter". The Christian experience is that we find freedom in being children of the Father in Christ. Through meeting Him and living in relationship with Him, we know who we are, know that we have a purpose, and can therefore be truly free, because we are loved by Him.

I had a few encounters with students that moved me. One is Leslie. Leslie is new to our group this year. She has graduated and is a graphic designer. After a few weeks of being with the Catholic Argos, she felt moved to share with the group that to her surprise she feels very inspired being around everyone. She wanted to express this gratitude by sharing some of her art with us, and made a decal for everyone to take home.

Then Shameka. After our night on experiencing freedom, she asked me, "Aren't we going to talk about Jesus? Why didn't you talk about Him tonight? It was like such an obvious connection!" I told her come back next week. But I was so happy that for Shameka, one of our seniors, Christ is so real, so present, that she can't talk about freedom without thinking of Jesus. This is the kind of experience that can bring the Gospel to the world today.

Finally, the Catholic Argos were assigned a table at the university commons this week with the Secular Student Alliance, basically the atheist student organization who are very active in promoting their ideas. After a very uncomfortable silent ten minutes, we ended up talking with Chase, Emily, and Jordan who are very active members of this group. It was a very friendly, happy conversation. I was mostly moved by the fact that we could talk to each other without yelling at each other. So much was discussed in those two hours we spent together. More to report on that next week. Let's all pray for our new friends Chase, Emily, and Jordan, that God can make these relationships bear fruit.


